These Easy-To-Build Medium-Size 40-Powered
World War II Fighters Should Make Great
Club Combat R/C Planes

Just recently, *Scale R/C Modeler* received a magazine from Italy with two very simple stand-off scale World War Two fighters. We dropped a note to the author, and he responded right away with plans, photos, and specifications. The script was in Italian, so we will have to assume that everyone out there can interpret the plans for these simple models.

Both aircraft share the same areas of fuselage, rudder, elevator, wing and airfoil, so they should fly alike.

Both the planes require four-channel radio systems, and can be powered with 30 to 40-size two-strokes.

Both renditions are conventional balsa-and-foam construction, and look as though they are very easy to build, and should fly nicely too.
